## Admissions Information & Admissions Placement Exam (APE) Reviews

### HOW TO ENROLL

#### Steps in the Admissions Process

- 1 Submit an application with a \$20 nonrefundable application fee to the Admissions Office.
- 2 Submit official copies of your high school transcript/GED and all college transcripts (if applicable) to the admissions office.
- 3 Submit acceptable APE (Admission Placement Exam) scores - SAT, ACT, Asset or Compass. If you have not taken one of these tests, contact admissions regarding test requirements. Your initial entrance test is FREE; however, there will be an additional charge for all re-tests. APE test scores are good for five years.
- 4 **Therefore, applicants who fail to meet the minimum scores for regular admissions are given the opportunity to retest one time per section.**
- 5 Some of SWGTC's Allied Health programs have a competitive admissions process. Some programs require an interview. You will be notified of additional steps after completing steps 1, 2, and 3 in the application process.
- 6 After your file is complete, you will be notified in writing of an admissions decision.

### Placement Exam

The Admissions Placement Exam (APE) is given to prospective students who wish to enroll in a degree, diploma or certificate program. All APE examinations are scheduled at Southwest Georgia Technical College. Please report to the Admissions Office in the Administration & Classroom Building (A) 15 minutes before the appointed test time. NOTE: Picture I.D. required. ### A Guarantee of Training to Georgia's employers

The Technical College System of Georgia guarantees employers that graduates of State Technical Colleges shall possess skills and knowledge as prescribed by State Curriculum Standards. Should any graduate employee within two years of graduation be deemed lacking in said skills, that student shall be retrained in any State Technical College at no charge for instructional costs to either the student or the employer.

### Financial Aid

Financial Aid is available to qualified students. SWGTC participates in the following programs: Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity (FSEOG), Work Study, WIA (formerly JTPA), HOPE Scholarship and various other scholarships. **Refund Policy:** In keeping with the new state-wide enrollment processing policy from the Technical College System of Georgia, SWGTC instituted a three (3) instructional day drop, 100% refund period, and a seven (7) calendar day add period at the beginning of each quarter. Students have the first three days of each quarter to drop any or all courses in which they are registered. If a course(s) is dropped during the first 3 days of the quarter, a 100% refund of all tuition and applicable fees will be refunded; a "W" grade will not be earned; and no hours will be counted against a financial aid cap. If a course is dropped after the third instructional day of the quarter, no refund will be issued, a "W" grade will be earned and credit hours will count against the financial aid cap.

- Preregistered students may receive a full refund of all tuition and other fees provided they cancel prior to the first day of class.
- Refunds, when due, must be made without requiring a request from the student.
- Refunds, when due, must be made within thirty (30) days (1) of the last day of attendance if written notification has been provided to the college by the student, or (2) from the date the college terminates the student or (3) determines withdrawal by the student.
- Tuition refunds for students receiving benefits through the Department of Veteran's Affairs will be prorated over the length of the course.

## **New Process Technical College System of Georgia/SWGTC Purging Process**

**The new state-wide Purging Process of no-shows and non-payers.  
This process is summarized below.**

### **Purging Enrollment**

- **Payment for tuition and fees is due by 4:00 p.m. one business day before the first day of each quarter. Students who do not have documented Financial Aid or Third Party Pay will be dropped from all courses if payment is not received by the specified date. Students who have been purged (dropped) for non-payment must re-register for classes in the admissions office and make payment at the business office. Late fees will be charged to all students who are purged and re-register. Students who re-register and have not made payment by the 7th calendar day of the quarter will be purged (dropped) and will not be allowed to re-register.**
- **Registered students who do not show up for the first day the class meets will be “No-Showed.” Students will have to obtain written permission from the instructor to be readmitted to the class by the Registrar.**

## WEB REGISTRATION INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

Web registration can be accessed directly through the internet at <http://swgtc16.southwestgatech.edu> site from any computer with internet access. Students may obtain PIN information from their advisors.

### WEB REGISTRATION NAVIGATION

**Do NOT use the back arrow in these screens. Use the “menu” links at the top of the screen. If you select exit, you will automatically be logged-off the system.**

- Step 1. “Login to Secure Area.” Enter your student identification number—this is your SSN. Tab to the PIN prompt.
- Step 2. Enter the PIN assigned to you by the College (check with your advisor). At the prompt, enter a new PIN of your choice. Re-enter your new PIN to confirm. Click “Login.”
- Step 3. Select “Student Services and Financial Aid. Select “Registration.” Select “Select Term.”
- Step 4. Select the term for which you are registering. This step will also be prompted when selecting “Add/Drop Classes.” After you have entered the term desired, select “Add/Drop” to continue. You may also select “Add/Drop Classes.”
- Step 5. Enter the CRN for the courses you want to take. Use the “Tab” key to move from one CRN space to another. Enter numbers carefully and confirm your entries. A reversal or other error in the numbers will register you for the wrong course. Confirm your schedule after you have submitted all of the courses. If a course is incorrect or there is a registration error, return to the “Add/Drop” screen and change your registration through the “Action” block.

Error Message	Explanation	Action
Closed	Class has reached its enrollment limit	Select another class or see your advisor to be put on wait list.
Duplicate Course	You have already registered for this course/section.	Drop the course from your schedule.
CRN does not exist	The CRN you entered is not recognized by the system.	Check the schedule to get the correct number and enter the correct CRN.
Maximum Hours Exceeded	You cannot register for more than the maximum hours. The maximum is 22 credit hours.	See your advisor.
Incorrect PIN	This is not the correct PIN, contact the admissions office to have the PIN reset.	Contact the Student Affairs office.
Major Restriction	This course is not part of your current major and will not be covered by Financial Aid	Contact Registrar's office

- Step 6. When you have completed schedule, select the “Exit” button at the top of the screen to close your registration session. This will log you off of the registration area. If you want to remain in the registration area but view other screens, select the “menu” button at the top of the screen. When ready to log-off and close your browser, select the “Exit” button.

- Step 7. Do a screen print of your schedule before exiting system.

**NOTE:** Students can use BannerWeb to check grades at end of quarters and to print unofficial transcripts.
